While the Spirit is everywhere, it is only effective in our experience to the extent to which we allow it to be so within us.

We have established that in the world, the play of the three forces (the law of the three), reflects the three fundamental conditions of Creation. These are known as static, dynamic and equilibrium, or in other circles Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We can never stress the importance of this law enough. Everything that exists in the Universe, in fact or potential, exists only by the grace of the combined love of these three faces of God. As this is a natural law, it is only just that we should find it natural to love it, as without it we are not in existence. As the natural law is God, it is right and proper that we recognise this fact and give our love to God.
