The Collect

Almighty God, we dedicate ourselves to your service, and in this dedication we ask that we be governed wisely by your hosts as we put our full trust in your care, following the pattern of our Christed Lord. Amen.

The Epistle for the 6th Sunday after Trinity is from the recorded messages of the Guru Paulji.

Untruths are an illusion, and illusions are like mistresses; we can have plenty of them without tying ourselves to responsibility. But truth insists on marriage. Once a person embraces truth they are united by its ruthless but gentle grasp. It is quite possible for a person to change the trend of their life, not by hearing or reading truth, but by making it an active part of their consciousness in daily experience, until it becomes a habit every moment of the day, instead of an occasional thought. Let God operate in the consciousness morning, noon, and night, until gradually the awareness comes. Then we make the transition from being hearers of the word to being doers of the word. Then shall we start living and shall gather in the harvest of souls.

The Gospel for the 6th Sunday after Trinity is from Edgar Cayce.

Attune self in body and in mind with that influence by which the entity seeks to be directed; not haphazardly, not by chance, but as of old, choose who will serve you this day; the living God within you, or those influences or knowledge without wisdom that would enslave you or empower you with the material things which only gratify for a moment. Better you choose as did the Saviour --- let others do as they may, but as for you, serve the living God. Thus you may use ability of spiritual attunement constructively, and may you use it as a helpful influence in your experiences on the earth.
