Intent - Serenity. Candles 6.

The Collect.

Unchanging and immortal God, grant that we may gain and hold that Holy Peace which naught can vex; through The Christ the prince of peace, who lives with you and the Holy Spirit, One God for evermore. Amen.

The Epistle for the 20th Sunday after Trinity is adapted from the writings of Rev. Trudy Kiessling, Sophia Divinity School.

It seems over the years the churches have made a point of going far from the concept that Jesus The Christ inaugurated. The concepts of sharing, loving and brotherhood have been dissipated. As a result they have made him (Jesus) an impossible remote figure, when they should be teaching that Jesus the man, attained the Christhood, thus the example is set.
