The Gospel for the 22nd Sunday after Trinity is from the works of Paul preaching to the Athenians.

Athenians, in all things I perceive that you are pious. For as I passed along, and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an Altar with this inscription, To the unknown God. What you venerate without knowing; I have come to enlighten you. God created the Universe and all things in it. God dwells not in temples made with our hands, nor does God require to be served by Human hands. We can give him nothing he has not already supplied us with. All the world is part of God. By this world of God do we exist, for without him we are not. God is in touch with all of us through this world, and we should show our reverence to our Planet, and in this way to God.
